Review of the Staff Judge Advocate

1. The attached record of trial of Katsuo Ishizawa, Koichi Ota, Yasushi Takasago, Zenkichi Koiwa, Heikichi Sato, Kishio Sasaki, and Nisa Tanifuji tried at Yokohama, Japan, from 7 January 1948 to 16 February 1948 by a Military Commission appointed by paragraph 2, Special Orders No. 3, Headquarters Eighth Army, United States Army, dated 5 January 1948 as amended by paragraph 21, Special Orders No. 9, Headquarters Eighth Army, United States Army, dated 13 January 1948, as amended by paragraph 2, Special Orders No. 27, Headquarters Eighth Army, United States Army, dated 4 February 1948, as amended by paragraph 1, Special Orders No. 31, Headquarters Eighth Army, United States Army, dated 9 February 1948, having been referred to the Staff Judge Advocate; this review thereof is submitted to the Commanding General.
